At a recent parish staff meeting, staff member Lenny Kelly made a report on the Ministry of Care. This ministry involves parishioners who are trained to visit the sick and homebound in our parish. We cover two Honor Health Hospitals, 20 healthcare facilities, and the homebound in our parish boundaries. Lenny reported that our ministers visited a total of 15,000 people over the course of the fiscal year (July, 2023-July, 2024). That is a lot of people.

I am grateful to the Ministry of Care for being dedicated to serving the sick and homebound. We are reminded in the scriptures that visiting the sick is what we are called to do, whether in a parish ministry, or we do this personally with those we know who are ill or homebound.

This might be another opportunity to ask parishioners to consider the possibility of being part of the Ministry of Care, whether being trained to visit the sick or maybe help behind the scenes. Would you consider serving in this ministry? Please contact Lenny Kelly at the Parish Office to find out more information about this ministry and see what makes sense for you to support this ministry either on the front lines or behind the scenes.

Every Mass we remind the sick that we have the tabernacle that reserves the hosts to bring to the sick and homebound. Staying connected to the community is important to those unable to join us for serious reasons.


What does the Assumption tell us about Heaven?

This coming Thursday, August 15, the church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As a holy day of obligation the Church is inviting us to deepen our understanding of Mary while growing in relationship to God. Even though this event is not recorded in the bible it has a long history in the tradition of the Church. It was commonly taught and believed that Mary held a unique role in the eyes of God and so the belief of Mary's assumption naturally followed. However, it was not until much later in history when this belief was defined as dogma in the Catholic Church. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." Everything we know and hold to be true about Mary comes from our belief and understanding of who Jesus Christ is. The dogma of the Assumption follows from the teaching of her Immaculate Conception and both follow from recognition of her status as the Mother of God. Mary who is born without sin is thus preserved from corruption and received into heaven both in body and spirit. Mary shares in her Son's glory from the beginning of her life to the very end.

The Assumption also tells us something about ourselves and heaven. Assumed into heaven, Mary reveals our own destiny in the glorification of our bodies united to the love and glory of God. In Mary we get a glimpse into the mystery that awaits us. In

Mary we see the fulfillment of God's promise and the culmination of what having a loving relationship with God is. If we grow in love with Mary we are drawn closer to God. The more we grow in love with Mary the more we will desire the glory of heaven. We are all meant for heaven, we are all called to holiness. Just as we are created in the image and likeness of God, God calls us back to communion with Him.

Pope Benedict XVI wrote that "precisely because Mary is with God and in God, she is very close to each one of us... Being in God, who is actually within all of us, Mary shares in this closeness of God." She knows the depths of our hearts, she hears our prayers, and she helps us along our journey as only a mother can. The Assumption calls us to meditate upon the example of Mary who dedicated her life to serving God. She offers us a model of faith so that we can align our hearts closer to God and desire heaven. Her Magnificat, her yes to God, should echo in our hearts every time we pray the Lord's prayer... "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."
