Dear Friends,

We live in a world where many people need to work long hours to help their businesses be successful, others to afford to raise a family, and others because their profession demands many hours. Some may find themselves unable to attend Mass and receive holy Communion. Sunday Mass is the ideal place to gather with the larger community. A habit can form when one does not come to Mass or Communion often because of work or maybe being a caregiver or for some other serious reason.

How about considering attending a weekday Mass? Receiving Communion and thanking God can be done at a weekday Mass. Rather than just saying one cannot go to Mass, it is for one's greater good to consider this way of worshiping. We have weekday Masses in our Daily Mass Chapel Monday through Friday at 8:00 am. Weekday Mass is a half hour, and is a more simplified Mass for the weekday while the Sunday Mass is the most beautiful of the entire week. Thanks to Fr. Bob Voss, a retired priest in our Diocese, he will be presiding at two weekday evening Masses on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 5:30 pm. For those who would like to come to Mass but mornings do not work out, we now can offer a couple of weekday evening Masses.

The Mass is offered 364 days a year. It is God's invitation to be nourished and fed at his table. I invite parishioners to consider making time to come to one of these Masses when our weekend Masses are not working out to attend. The greater good is coming to Mass, even if the weekend does not work. As scriptures remind us, taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

The Prayers of a Mother

Parents are the first teachers of the faith. They bear witness to this responsibility first by creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, and service are the rule. Whether you realize it or not your example of prayer and faith has a deep impact on those around you. One of the best ways to evangelize or impart our faith to others is by living out our faith through prayer and acts of service. Parents have the mission of teaching their children to pray and to discover their vocation as children of God. Of course, that is not always an easy thing to do. St. Monica knew this all too well.

On August 27 we celebrate the feast of St. Monica. St. Monica's life could have easily made her a bitter wife or a despairing parent, yet she did not give in to any of those temptations. Monica was a dedicated Christian, who dedicated her life to the conversion of her family. Her example of faith and prayer eventually led to the conversion of both her husband and son to Christianity. Her husband died one year after his baptism. The most famous of her children was St. Augustine. In his youth St. Augustine was deeply involved in an immoral lifestyle. Monica saw the path Augustine was going down and prayed every day for the conversion of her son. Her prayers were finally answered and before she died she was able to witness the baptism of her son.

Nearing her death, she told Augustine, "Son, nothing in this world now affords me delight. I do not know what there is now left for me to do or why I am still here, all my hopes in this world are now fulfilled." In his book, "The Confession," St. Augustine acknowledges how the virtues and prayers of his mother changed his life and lead him back to God.

The example of St. Monica is a testament to what the prayers of a mother can do. She is a

reminder for all parents to never stop praying for your children even if they have fallen away from the Church. You never know how God is using you, or how God is working in their life. Sometimes all it takes is the example of your faith and prayer to make all the difference. If you are a parent, or simply have a desire to support and form the youth, I invite you to consider being a part of youth ministry. If you would like to get more involved in



Elementary Formation 2024-25 Sacrament Preparation

The first step in registering for sacraments is to attend a Parent Orientation. Attend only once and there is no need to RSVP.

- Thursday, Sept. 26, 6:00 7:30 pm, Fenlon Hospitality Center
- Wednesday, Oct. 2, 6:00 7:30 pm, Daily Mass Chapel

Children do not need to attend the Orientation, but are most welcome to attend if needed.



- In the Diocese of Phoenix children typically prepare for Reconciliation in second grade & above, and First Communion and Confirmation in third grade & above.
- Preparation for Reconciliation must come prior to the Celebration of First Communion and Confirmation.
- All children must have concurrent enrollment in a Faith Formation program such as CGS (Atrium), Family Faith Formation, ROCK45, or attend a Diocesan Catholic School.


