Social Justice

Our Annual Back to School Drive will run from July 13 - July 28, 2024

During our Parish Back to School Supply Drive from July 13-28, please take this time to pray for these children who are experiencing the loss of a parent in the form of Incarceration. Remember them, their parents, and caregivers in your daily prayers.

Many of you who participated in the Get on the Bus event here on Mother's Day weekend saw firsthand the challenges a child is faced with when a parent is in prison. It also places extra emotional stress and financial challenges on the remaining caregiver at home.

A child faces a certain amount of trauma and confusion when a parent is incarcerated. There is also the embarrassing stigma at school they may face from their peers. Because of this, they may begin to feel a deeper sense of isolation. It is not uncommon for an incarcerated parent to be housed hundreds of miles away and the child has no control whether anyone will take them to see their parent.

Besides collecting the new school supplies during this event for St. Matthew and Roadrunner Elementary Schools, we also collect Walmart or Target gift cards specifically for these Children of the Incarcerated.

These children and their families are then visited by the director from the Diocese of Phoenix Prison Ministry who shares our gifts and prayers with them from our parish community which helps them kick off the school year in a good direction. It is the hope that we all can assist children and families in need to encounter the living Christ in their day to day school activities, social life and the familial experiences that create their individual realities.


