# The Solemnity of St. Joseph

On March 19 the Church celebrates the Solemnity of St. Joseph. We celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph commemorating him as a model of humility, compassion, and love. To this day St. Joseph remains a great model for all men seeking to live out their faith. The example of St. Joseph challenges all of us to open ourselves up to the will of God even in the midst of hardship and uncertainty. His example reminds us to not give into fear but rather to stand up for our beliefs and those we love. To lay down your life for those you care about. To trust in God when things are difficult. Fear can be a powerful motivator, but love is a much better one.

The culture of fear is all too prevalent today. We are afraid of being left out, we are afraid of being counter-cultural, we are afraid of being seen as small minded, we are afraid of being rejected. St. Joseph gives us a great example of how we are to respond. He had plenty to be afraid of, just think about the trials he had to endure: an unexpected pregnancy, his trip to Bethlehem, his flight to Egypt, and then losing his child in the Temple. St. Joseph doesn't act in fear but rather courageously responds to Mary and to God.

I am sure he had his own uncertainties about God's plan. But with St. Joseph there is a lesson for us. There is nothing certain in life, and we

can never fully grasp the context of God's divine plan in our life. And yet we see Joseph is willing to reorient his life, reorient his struggles and doubts in the context of God's plan. He surrenders his own plan and his own ambitions to God. With faith brings the challenge of seeing things differently through the eyes of faith. During this Lenten season let us pray for the intercession of St. Joseph so that we can be drawn closer to God and be open to His will in our lives. Below is a prayer from Pope Francis dedicated to St. Joseph:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,
and defend us from every evil.
Amen.









# TIME TOGETHER:

+ Each time you see your grandchildren, end your time together by making the sign of the cross on their foreheads and telling them "God loves you very much and so do I." This quick blessing will leave them feeling loved and valued.



- + This Spring, draw a family tree with your grandchildren and discuss its branches. Talk about each family member and share stories and memories together.
- Gather some fun props and take a few photos together. Print them out and display in your home for when your grandchildren visit.

# Re(ipe: HOT CROSS BUNS

Cooking with grandchildren is a memory maker. Recipes are part of the fiber of families. Try this recipe during Lent. The crosses on the buns represent Jesus' love for us.

- -8 oz. can Pillsbury refrigerated crescent rolls
- -1/3 cup of raisins (a snack size box)
- -1/4 cup powdered sugar
- -1 Tsp. milk
- -Grated peel of half a meyer lemon (optional)

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Spray 8 regular size muffin cups with cooking spray. Separate dough into 8 triangles. In a small bowl, mix raisins and lemon peel. Spoon raisin mixture evenly on the narrow end of each triangle. Roll up to enclose filling and pinch dough to form a ball. Then, press seams to seal. Place buns, seam side down, in muffin cups. Bake for 11-12 minutes, or until golden. Remove from pan to cooling rack, cool for at least 20 minutes.

In a small bowl, mix powdered sugar and milk (icing will be thick). Spoon icing into a small Ziploc bag, and cut off a tiny corner of the bag. Squeeze bag to pipe icing in a cross shape on the top of each cooled bun.

# Almsgiving and Catholic Social Justice: A Call to Action

Almsgiving, one of the key tenets of Catholic life, is not just about giving money to those in need; it is an act deeply rooted in Catholic Social Teaching (CST) and social justice. In its essence, almsgiving is a concrete expression of solidarity, one of CST's central principles, which calls us to stand with the poor and vulnerable in society. It goes beyond charity to embody a sense of communal responsibility for addressing the root causes of poverty and inequality.

Catholic Social Teaching emphasizes that wealth and resources should be shared with those who have less, not just out of generosity, but out of justice. The principle of preferential option for the poor encourages us to prioritize the needs of the most marginalized, ensuring that they have access to basic needs such as food, shelter, healthcare, and education. Almsgiving, when approached with this perspective, becomes an invitation to actively participate in transforming society to reflect God's love and justice.

Additionally, almsgiving aligns with the call to promote the common good—creating a society where everyone has the opportunity to thrive. It is a reminder that each individual's well-being is intertwined with the well-being of others. When we give, we are not simply providing temporary relief, but working toward long-term systemic change that promotes equity, dignity, and opportunity for all.

Almsgiving, then, is not just about meeting immediate needs but is an invitation to live out the Gospel's call to love our neighbors as ourselves. It challenges us to engage in acts of justice and mercy, building a world that reflects the Kingdom of God.

In a world where social inequalities persist, almsgiving remains an important and tangible way to live out the principles of Catholic Social Teaching, reminding us that charity is not just an act of kindness, but a commitment to creating a more just and compassionate society.




