Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

The Way of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross, has long been a devotional practice observed during Lent. The stations grew out of an imitation of the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem which is believed to be the actual path Jesus walked to Mount Calvary. Tradition holds that Mary, herself led by example in making daily visits to the sites of her Son's sufferings, death and resurrection following his ascension into heaven. For those who could not make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, this practice developed to take place in churches with markers placed for each station throughout the nave of the church. Praying through the Stations is a great way to contemplate the Passion of Christ as we draw closer to Good Friday. Each station recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day on Earth as a man. Over the years there have been a number of guides and prayers to help the Christian faithful pray the Stations and view the Passion of Christ with a different perspective. Two of the most popular devotional guides come from St. Francis of Assisi and St. Alphonsus Liguori. There are also very powerful guides written through the eyes of Mary known as Mary's Way of the Cross. Taking the time to reflect on the passion and death of Christ is a great way to unite our suffering and the suffering of others to the hope of the

resurrection. The Stations challenge us to examine our lives as we strive to live a life of virtue by looking at the times we fall short and by challenging us to recognize the presence of God in all those we encounter.

During this time of Lent, we are asked to make prayer, fasting, and almsgiving a part of our daily life. If you have never prayed the Stations of the Cross, or if you are still looking for something to do to increase your prayer life during this Lent, I encourage you to take up this practice. I have personally found this form of prayer a powerful experience and a great way to center myself during Lent. Here at St. Patrick we gather every Friday at 6:00 pm throughout Lent in the Church to pray the Stations. We can learn a lot from following the footsteps of Christ.





The next meeting will be held on **Monday**, **April 28** at 9:00 am in Fenlon Hospitality Center.

The children are busy in the Atrium, exploring the sacred season of Lent. This week, our Level 1 children explore the Empty Tomb. Our Level 2 children are presented with the City of Jerusalem. Our 3-D model of the City of Jerusalem illustrates where the events of the Triduum (Christ's Last Supper, death, and resurrection) took place. As we retell the events of the last days of Jesus, we place materials representing first the walls around the city, the water pools, the Temple in the upper part of the city, the Cenacle where the Last Supper was celebrated in the Upper Room, the Garden of Olives, the residences of the High Priest and Herod, the Palace of Pontius Pilate, and then the Place of the Crucifixion. Here we placed the cross, and then a depiction of the tomb that is closed with a stone. Recalling Jesus' resurrection, we open the tomb and light a candle representing the Light of Christ that now fills those who follow Him.


