Dear Friends,

There are many Catholics who take the season of Lent seriously. A springtime of cleaning our personal houses by making new priorities and taking away things that are not useful in our lives. During this time, there is an awareness of addressing sin in our lives and many take an opportunity to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation.

Every Wednesday during Lent we have confessions available. We will have two priests available for confessions from 6:00 - 7:30 pm. A minister of hospitality will greet and guide people for confessions. It is to help people feel welcome or to

lessen the anxiety that some might experience. The two major times for confessions will be Wednesday, April 9 from 6:00 - 7:30 pm with five priests in the church that evening. The last opportunity will be Wednesday, April 16 with eight priests for confessions from 6:00 - 8:00 pm. For these two dates mentioned, priests will be present until the last person has gone to confession so no one misses out.

Every Saturday from 3:00 - 4:00 pm will be confession as usual. Please check out your parish YouTube Channel for our Lent Penance Service video. It will help people make an examination of conscience and pray before going to confession. For those who for serious reasons cannot make it to confession, they may use this video to make a good confession.

To those who have been away from this sacrament for many years, please consider the possibility of going to this sacrament. The priests we use are very compassionate and will guide anyone who needs extra support. We were blessed at Advent with a good number of people choosing to return to this sacrament.

Remember the beautiful Psalm that states the Lord is kind and merciful.

## 40 Days in the Desert

As Jesus journeys into the desert, we begin our journey into the season of Lent. Just after his baptism, Jesus is led by the Holy Spirit into the desert and tempted by the devil. He spends forty days fasting in the desert. Forty recalls various periods of preparation in the Old Testament such as the forty days Moses spent fasting on Mt. Sinai when given the Ten Commandments, the forty years the Israelites spent wandering the desert before entering the promise land, the forty days of rain with Noah during the great flood. It is no coincidence that there are forty days in Lent. The Catechism states: "By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert." The season of Lent is meant to draw us into Christ's temptation in the desert; not only spiritually through prayer and almsgiving but also physically through periods of fasting and denying ourselves worldly pleasures.

Temptation is a recurring theme of the Christian life. It was Adam and Eve's failure to resist temptation that caused sin to enter the world in the first place. The three temptations which Christ experiences in the desert echo the temptations that Adam and Eve gave into in the Garden of Eden: eating forbidden food, false worship, and testing God. It also reflects the temptations of the Israelites wandering in the desert. The first temptation echoes Adam eating the forbidden fruit and Israel's complaint against Moses for depriving them of the bread they had in Egypt. The second trial reflects the

influence the devil in the world towards false worship. This mirrors the temptation to false worship that the Israelites had in the desert, both at the incident of the Golden Calf and other false gods. Finally, in response to testing God, Jesus quotes back Moses in which he rebukes the Israelites for having a lack of trust in God. Jesus rebukes Satan with each temptation and relies completely on God the Father to withstand them. He was tired, hungry, and weary, just as any of us would be from wandering in the desert; but even in his humanity, Christ prevails. Jesus was tempted as we are in life. Temptations are not bad in themselves, but it is what we do with them that can help us turn to God or away from God. Reflecting on Christ's time and temptation in the desert serves as a guiding beacon of hope.

Jesus was tempted, just as we all are, yet he proves that through steadfast prayer and total reliance on God the Father, temptation loses its power. At the heart of all temptations is the act of pushing God aside because we perceive him as secondary. This Lenten season make God the primary center of your life and place your trust in Him alone.









