The Gospel of Jesus Christ is central to our Catholic faith, and with it comes many ways to deepen our relationship with God. Our parish community chooses a theme to help us go deeper into understanding a particular teaching of Christ.

The Cost of Discipleship

Over the past few weeks, as we read from the Gospel of Luke, Christ has been showing us there is a high cost to being his disciple. To follow Christ means putting him before all else including family and possessions. The words of Christ are challenging to say the least, "anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." The passage we hear this weekend highlights that discipleship requires a radical and uncompromising commitment to God. Last week we heard about the importance of humility, and this week we heard about detachment. Jesus's teaching is a radical, counter-cultural call that directly opposes worldly values of individualism and accumulation. He provides two brief stories to illustrate the importance of "counting the cost" and giving up all for God. Similar to the message we heard a few weeks ago, Jesus warns there is a cost to following him. The Gospel shows us the importance of placing Jesus above all else including family, self-interest, and possessions.

Jesus does not shy away from reminding us there is a cost to following him. It comes down to our priorities. Sometimes we might have to disappoint our families or friends when putting the Lord first, giving him the time he deserves. It is easy to get caught up in the world, focusing on paying bills, putting kids through college, planning for retirement, or on just having fun, that we put Jesus second. Thomas A. Kempis, the Christian writer of 'The Imitation of Christ', commented that: "Many come following Jesus who love his heavenly kingdom but few come looking forward to suffering. Many admire His miracles but few follow Him in humiliation to the cross." If we want to be true disciples of Jesus, we must not forget there is a cost and there will always be a cross to bear, but we must also remember we are not alone either.

Jesus and His disciples pluck grain on the Sabbath, prompting criticism from the Pharisees. Jesus responds by highlighting that human need and mercy stand at the heart of God's law. From a stewardship perspective, this challenges us to recognize that our resources giving, praying and serving are meant to serve God's purposes, not just to maintain appearances or follow rules. True stewardship is guided by compassion and responsiveness to the needs of others, even when it is inconvenient or misunderstood.

Reflection question:

How is God inviting me to use my gifts to serve others with compassion — even when it challenges my comfort or routine?
