Dear Friends,

Human conflict grabs many eyeballs. Many people give their attention to things when people are not getting along, when disagreements go to the edge, and when unpredictable behavior causes chaos, it is noticed. We live in a world where ratings can drive how stories are told and some people benefit from humans being angry with one another. However we want to spin this, people are exposed to these behaviors daily. That is the truth.

What can be concerning is when the lessons learned are that we can ignore what the youth and impressionable people are being told, that this is justified behavior. They absorb behavior that uses foul language towards others, and flipping off those we label as enemies is encouraged by others. This is what I see daily and it breaks my heart. Yes,

there are many good people and the good is always more than what is horrible or evil. Yet I see a good number of people, including those who call themselves Christians, disrespect and mistreat others. I am tired of this being presented to me and it goes against what our faith claims to call us to be.

Nothing new has been said here, we know this. I have come to believe we need a theme that can direct our actions and thoughts towards the ideals of the Kingdom of God.

Our theme this fall is **I WILL LOOK TWICE UNTIL I SEE CHRIST IN YOU.** We can easily forget the dignity of every human being, that all are created in God's image, and even when there is disagreement or a need to forgive, we choose the path that Jesus calls all his followers to live, to love one another.

Even though the news outlets will present us with conflict, anger, and disrespect because those things get the best ratings, we Christians need to call on the grace of God to have a different behavior.

We will have several weeks to break this open, to lead us up to the election, and to respond after the election. This theme is central to who we claim to be.

I want a community that lives the Gospel in a way that makes a difference in our community. I want us to lift each other up and see Christ in all we encounter. This is not easy and it is not a pie-in-the-sky fantasy. This is the path of the cross.

I ask that we open our minds and hearts to what the Spirit is asking us to do. I WILL LOOK TWICE UNTIL I SEE CHRIST IN YOU.

The Exallation of the Holy Cross

On September 14 the Church celebrates the feast of the Holy Cross. The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates two historical events: the discovery of the True Cross by St. Helena, the mother of the Emperor Constantine, in 320 in Jerusalem, and the dedication of the shrine built on Calvary by Constantine, which marks the site of the Crucifixion. While Good Friday is dedicated to the Passion and Crucifixion of Jesus, on this feast day we celebrate the cross itself as the instrument of our salvation. For many of us the cross has become another ordinary symbol. We see it all the time in churches, on necklaces, on t-shirts, as tattoos. The cross has become something we are used to seeing, it no longer shocks us or makes us think. But in the early years of the Church the cross was a symbol of controversy. To the eyes of the first Christians, it had no beauty. The cross after all was an instrument of execution. It would have been equivalent to wearing an image of an electric chair or a guillotine. But today the cross is the universal image of Christian belief. On the feast of the Holy Cross we acknowledge the ultimate sacrifice that took place on the cross for us.

The cross should always remind us of the

unconditional love of God. What happened over 2000 years ago on Good Friday, at the top of a hill on a cross, happened for you. The cross signifies victory over death itself, it means freedom from all our limitations and brokenness. Christ gave us the model of love and salvation. Without sacrifice there is no redemption, without the cross there is no salvation. St. Rose of Lima used to say, "apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven." I hope you can take some time this week to contemplate the meaning of that quote. What cross do you have to carry in life? We cannot expect to grow closer to Christ without carrying our own cross. It is easy to wear a necklace of a cross or put the cross on the wall at home, but it is much harder to carry our own cross each day. In carrying our cross we know we are not alone. By exalting the cross of Christ we recognize the infinite mercy of God which flows from the selfless sacrifice on the cross. The entrance antiphon of the feast sums it up nicely, "We should






commitment to their country has too often been forgotten.

Recipe:



FLAVORED PUMPKIN SEEDS

Boil pumpkin goop in salted water to separate seeds from the membrane. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Then, heat 2 tbsp. butter in the microwave until melted. Toss 2 cups of pumpkin seeds in melted butter to coat them, then toss with desired flavor.

Spread the seeds out on a baking sheet and roast for 25-27 minutes, or until lightly golden.

- +Ranch: 1 1/2 tbsp. ranch seasoning mix
- +Pumpkin Pie: 3 tbsp. brown sugar and 1 1/2 tsp.




